I presume you are aware that the Appellate Department of the Superior Court affirmed the convictions on Count One (PC 602j) but reversed on Count Two (PC 602 l). We petitioned for transfer to the DCA; this was denied, and the remittitur has issued to the trial court. On two of the other cases, where the defendants did not testify, a petition for rehearing has been granted.

John Porter is no longer representing Hal Brown. Enclosed is a substitution of attorneys executed by each of them, with the name of the substituted attorney left blank.
