As we promised you, this is the reminder and schedule for the CORE Legal Conference to be held at the Park-Sheraton Hotel at 55th Street and Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, beginning Friday afternoon, February 19th and extending through the early afternoon Sunday, February 21st. This will give those who want to spend an extra day in New York a chance to avail themselves of the rest of Sunday and February 22nd, Washington's Birthday.

The Conference will start Friday afternoon at 2:30 P.M., with the registration beginning at 2:00 P.M. There will be no registration fee! Obviously, this invitation is extended not only to you personally, but as well to any lawyers whom you care to invite. The only charge will be for the dinner-Saturday evening at \$7.50 per person. It goes without saying that wives and friends, male or female, are welcome, not only to the dinner, but to any session of the Conference as well should they wish to come.

We enclose an application card, which we hope you will send back as quickly as possible in the self-addressed envelope, so that we may make all the necessary arrangements with the hotel. We also enclose a reservation card which you can use if you choose to stay at the Park-Sheraton, stamped and self-addressed, which can be mailed directly to the hotel.
